

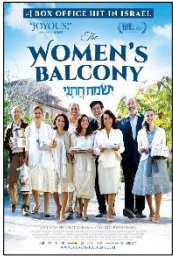

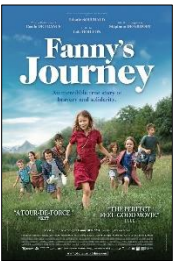
Join us for our **Sixth Annual Augusta Jewish Film Festival**. The AJCC, AYS, CCI and Federation have once again joined together to present the five films listed below. These movies represent a variety of Jewish themes: comedies, dramas, thrillers and historical events.



Tuesday, April 25

The Women's Balcony, Language: Hebrew with subtitles

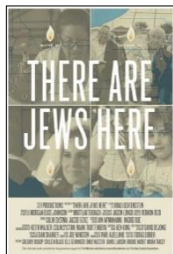
An accident during a Bar Mitzvah celebration leads to a gender rift in a devout Orthodox community in Jerusalem in this rousing, good-hearted tale about women speaking the truth to patriarchal power. This film was the highest grossing and number one box office hit in Israel in 2016, was nominated for five Ophir Awards (the Israeli equivalent of our Academy Awards), was the Los Angeles Critic's Pick of the Week when released in the U.S. and won first place for narrative at the Atlanta Jewish Film Festival.



Tuesday, May 2

Fanny's Journey, Language: French with subtitles

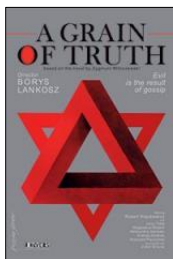
In 1943, Fanny and her sisters were sent from their home in France to an Italian foster home for Jewish children. When the Nazis arrive in Italy, her caretakers desperately organize the departure of the children to Switzerland. Left on their own, these children do the impossible and reach the Swiss border to freedom. Based on a true story, this film has been chosen the Audience Favorite in seven Jewish Film Festivals, including Fort Lauderdale, Atlanta and Charleston.



Thursday, May 4

There Are Jews Here, Language: English

This documentary tells the individual stories of four once-thriving American Jewish communities (Latrobe, PA; Butte, MT; Laredo, TX; and Dothan, AL) that are now fighting for survival. In Dothan, we catch a glimpse of a young NY family who takes up the community's offer to provide young Jews up to \$50,000 to relocate to, and help rebuild, Dothan's Jewish community. **There Are Jews Here** has been shown at Jewish film festivals in Atlanta, San Francisco and Milwaukee.



Monday, May 8

A Grain of Truth, Language: Polish with subtitles

A maverick prosecutor finds himself dragged into the investigation of a string of ritual killings rooted in Poland's anti-Semitic past in a suspenseful detective thriller. Based on the bestselling novel by Polish author Zygmunt Miloszewski, **A Grain of Truth** is a masterfully constructed whodunit that pits forces of enlightenment against monstrous primeval superstitions.



Thursday, May 11

Moos, Language: Dutch with subtitles

It's Hanukkah evening and everything is the way it's always been for Moos, who stayed in her hometown to take care of her father after her mother's passing. But when her longtime childhood friend arrives as a surprise guest from Israel, Moos gets the jolt she needs to examine her life and the choices she has made.
